

Reception

- Physical**
- Football** - Health and fitness coupled with foot to eye co-ordination.
 - Yoga** - learn about our bodies through movement and stretches
 - Multi-Sport** - A chance for the reception students to practice and improve their physical attributes, whilst having as much fun as possible!
- Academic**
- Julia Donaldson Reading Club** - Students will listen to and read stories from the Julia Donaldson collection, discussing characters, making predictions and answering questions on the books
 - Good Manners & Emotional Stability Books Reading Club**
Read this kind of books together to develop children's good manners and emotional stability.
 - Anthony Browne's Book Club** - Children will have fun in reading Anthony Browne's books, we will discuss the deep meaning of stories if it has, ask and answer questions, and encourage students to draw or even write their own ideas about stories in super simple words.
- Creative**
- Colouring Club** - Coloring enhances students improve fine motor skills and train their brain to focus. Students will be accomplishing different theme of coloring everyweek.
 - Lego Construction** - Building with Lego is a great way to develop teamwork and problem solving skills. Each week we set a new challenge with a theme for the children as we encourage and develop their imagination and creativity. Children will have opportunities to follow instructions to create models and a chance to create their own designs.
 - Puzzle Play** - Young students will develop their finger strength, perseverance, memory skills, as well as the ability to plan, test ideas and solve problems.
 - Creative Paper Cutting and Sticking Picture Club** - We will have a different paper cutting theme every week, to make stick-on picture, to cultivate children's creativity and imagination.
 - Origami** - Origami is the Japanese traditional art of making figures by folding paper. We are going to make various kind of shapes and children will have the opportunity to enhance their imagination through the process.

- English & Chinese Simple Songs Singing Club** - Reception children can be familiar with more English & Mandarin words through simple songs learning and singing along.
- Enrichment**
- Funky Fingers** - "Playdough is a wonderful sensory and learning experience for children. They will learn to think creatively. The squeezing, pinching and pulling movements also strengthens their hand muscles and develops their fine motor skills."

Key Stage 1 (Years 1~2)

- Physical**
- Dodgeball Champions** - Students will learn to work together in a team and use their eye-hand coordination whilst catching and throwing the balls.
 - Swimming** - Lessons will focus on developing the 3 main swimming styles: Free Style, back stroke and breast stroke.
 - Badminton** - Focus on badminton basics, techniques, and games.
 - Basketball** - Developing team basketball skills in dribbling, passing & shooting

- Spanish Language and Culture** - The purpose of the Spanish Club is to learn of the Hispanic and Latin culture and to provide an opportunity to speak Spanish in an informal setting and to learn more about the Hispanic world.
 - Julia Donaldson Reading Club** - Students will listen to and read stories from the Julia Donaldson collection, discussing characters, making predictions and answering questions on the books
 - Korean Native Club** - Korean native speakers for Y1-2 will develop their Korean language skills. Especially vocabulary and expression skills.
 - Mandarin Story Club for Native Speakers** - Developing students' abilities of listening, language expression and performance, children will learn how to retell the story through various activities.
 - Beginners French** - An introduction to the
 - French language** - children will learn to hold a basic conversation using everyday French vocabulary
 - Beginners Japanese** An introduction to the Japanese language - children will learn basic Japanese conversation and vocabulary.
 - Traditional Tales and Nursery Rhymes** - Students will learn a range of traditional stories and rhymes and complete games and projects for each.
 - Literacy & Animation**- Students will watch short animations and create written and visual texts about them.
 - Fun with Phonics** - Children will review and enhance their knowledge of English phonics through a range of games, stories and activities
- Creative**
- Cartoon Drawing** - Creating different cartoon characters by following step by step instructions, improving creativity and hand eye coordination.
 - Creative Art** - Children will be learning some art skills and trying new things by using different materials to create art. It is designed to enhance children's natural abilities to see elements such as line, shape, colour and composition.
 - Chinese Calligraphy for Native Speakers** - Traditional Chinese Calligraphy (using ink and brush) will be introduced to children. Nice and relaxing for beginners to learn a bit about Chinese culture.
 - LEGO Construction** - Building with Lego is a great way to develop teamwork and problem solving skills. Each week we set a new challenge with a theme for the children as we encourage and develop their imagination and creativity. Children will have opportunities to follow instructions to create models and a chance to create their own designs.
 - Clay Craft** - Improving children's fine motor skills by shaping the clay into different items with their imagination and creativity.
 - Drawing Club** - Developing motor skills in drawing following instructions and step by step guides
 - Origami** - Children will find out how to fold many easy, cool and interesting origami with colour papers.
 - Animate Drawing** - Students will learn basic animated drawing skills.

Key Stage 1 (Years 1~2)

Mosaic Art - We will be using small squares of paper to create mosaic style art. Through mosaic art children learn about shapes and how they fit together. They are introduced to patterns, and can practice their fine motor skills while using their imagination and decision making skills.

Enrichment Construction Club - Children will use a range of construction materials to achieve building objectives which also help develop team work, communication and fine motor skills.

Beginners Chess - Learn chess tactics, principles and plans

Boardgames - Board Games Club aims to promote board games as a recreational activity that boosts strategic thinking skills and social interaction. This club is a platform for students with a common interest in board games to come together to have fun and to build relationships. Through participation in the games, students can master new skills and concepts in an enjoyable way.

Midfullness Expression - Exploring a variety of strategies to express mindfulness through breathing, yoga, stories, music and art and construction.

Music Junior Britannica Voices (Years 1-3) - Britannica's premier club for choral activities. All aspiring singers should sign up.

Key Stage 2 (Years 3~5)

- Physical**
- Sports Appreciation** - A look at all the different sports around the world, their cultural differences, and a history of each sport.
 - Dodgeball Champions** - Students will learn to work together in a team and use their eye-hand coordination whilst catching and throwing the balls.
 - Scottish Country Ceilidh Dancing** - Students will keep fit and have fun learning traditional Ceildhi dances
 - Badminton** - Students develop hand and eye co-ordination skills to apply to the sport of Badminton through different activities that translate into playing full games.
 - Football** - Students will complete drills and improve their footballing skills
 - Netball** - Students will develop different skills at netball such as, improving hand-eye coordination, promoting teamwork, improved flexibility, reaction time and stamina.
 - Table Tennis** - Table tennis is a fantastic way to develop students hand-eye coordination, reflexes and coordination whilst improving their fitness and tactical abilities.
 - Swimming** - Lessons will focus on developing the 3 main swimming styles: Free Style, back stroke and breast stroke.
- Academic**
- Club de español (Spanish: Daily Conversational Skills)** - Students will acquire some of the basic conversational skills necessary to communicate daily in Spanish
 - Beginners German** - An introduction to the German language - children will learn to hold a basic conversation using everyday German vocabulary
 - Maths - Problem Solving (Year 5 and 6)** - Advanced Maths Skills: Upper Key Stage 2 - focusing on problem solving and wordy problems.
 - Book Club** - Students will collaboratively select a book, and learn how to work in small groups to independently read and discuss their thoughts on a novel.
 - English Writing Skills Intervention-Year 5 and 6** - By invitation only children in Year 5 and 6 will develop and build upon their understanding of a range of skills within their writing, strengthening their confidence and abilities within this key area of the curriculum.
 - Maths skills Intervention Year 5 and 6** - By invitation only children will have the opportunity to refine their skills in maths, focusing on key areas of the Year 5 and 6 curriculum. Participants will learn to develop their core skills in this complex area of the curriculum.
 - Mandarin Readers Club** - Students will read a various of Mandarin books, and have stories read to them. They will discuss titles, storylines, writers, related movies about the books they read and enjoy some drama activities related to Chinese folk tales.
 - Beginners French** - Students will learn basic French vocabulary to enable them to have a short conversation in French.
 - Korean History** - Native Korean speakers for KS2 will learn various Korean history and common sense.
 - Storytelling** - Students will learn how to read, write and tell different stories through more than 50 original stories.
 - Spanish Language and Culture** - The purpose of the Spanish Club is to learn of the Hispanic and Latin culture and to provide an opportunity to speak Spanish in an informal setting and to learn more about the Hispanic world.

Key Stage 2 (Years 3~5)

- Creative**
- Chinese Comic-making Club** - Students will create their own unique Chinese comics on the computer, including but not limited to your school life, family life, hobbies, food, etc.
 - Paper Quilling Club** - The Children will be developing creativity, imagination skills and hand-eye coordination.
 - Mandala Art Creation** - Students will learn how to design and create their own Mandala art pieces using a variety of different utensils and resources.
 - Bracelet making** - Students will learn how to design and create their own wool bracelets using a variety of weaving and knotwork skills
 - Movie Making** - The children will plan, direct, edit and star in their own movies using the I-Moive app
 - Sketch Club** - The children will explore and develop a multitude of sketching techniques through various pieces of Artwork and also have time to produce their own creative work.
 - Robotics** - Students will use our lego mindstorm and micro:bit education to programme and create their own robots.
 - Collage** - Students will be using magazine pictures, cards, shapes to create art.
 - Embroidery** - Students will learn a range of basic stitches to create an art piece with thread
 - Minecraft** - Students explore virtually infinite and procedurally generated infinite worlds, using a map seed obtained from the system clock. Students are challenged to build learning spaces within an infinitely large game world generated on the horizontal plane.
- Music**
- Folk Ensemble** - Open to players of tin whistles, ukulele (limited), violin, flute, guitar
 - Britannica Voices (Year 4,5, Secondary)** - Britannica's premier club for choral activities. All aspiring singers should sign up.
 - Xylophone Ensemble** - Learn traditional music from West Africa on the xylophones. Open to all but highly recommended for piano players and children interested in drumming.
 - Concert Band** - Invite-only ensemble music groups for KS2 and above. New students to contact Mr Troy directly
- Enrichment**
- Disney-Explore The Magical Kingdom** - Come and explore the magical world of Disney, create your own characters, scenarios and storylines whilst diving into the underlying themes, plots and characterisation.
 - Puzzle Play** - Teamwork, collaborating and social skills. Working together to problem solve puzzles as well as designing and making their own.
 - Boardgame Club** - Board games are a fantastic way to develop a multitude of skills such as strategic thinking, communication, focus and competitiveness whilst allowing children to a chance to be humble in both victory and defeat.
 - Mandarin Riddle Club** - The riddles game contains riddles, and you will need to identify the object based on the riddles. It challenges both your brain and eye.
 - World Geography** - Students will be discussing various aspects of natural geography from around the world i.e. rivers, mountains, etc. As well as an introduction to various countries around the world.
 - Quiz Club** - Students will take part in a range of quiz types and topics. They will work individually and collaboratively as a team to both answer questions and eventually make their own make their own quizzes.

Secondary (Years 6+)

- Physical**
- Basketball** - Developing team basketball skills in passing & shooting
 - Intermediate Golf** - Students will continue working on current skill level, beyond the basics.
 - Physical Fitness** - Students will participate in functional and circuit training. This will improve their energy levels, metabolic rate, strength and endurance.
 - Beginners Golf** - Golf for beginners - students will learn the basics of a golf swing (gripping the club to hitting the ball)
 - Sporting Development** - Introduction and enjoyment of various competitive games. The students will be learning new and various sports.
 - Rugby** - Students will develop the needed skills for rugby including passing, kicking, footwork, speedwork and incorporate this into a team environment.
 - Football** - Continuation of last terms football drills, games and matches.
 - Dodgeball Champions** - Students will learn to work together in a team and use their hand-eye coordination whilst catching and throwing the balls.
 - Ultimate Frisbee** - Ultimate frisbee, introduction to the sport Britannica play competitively in Britannica Knights. Throwing, coordination and teamwork.
 - Handball** - Students will develop passing and shooting skills to participate in handball games.
 - Table Tennis** - Students learn the techniques of handling the bat to create consistency in their game.
- Academic**
- Korean Society and History** - Native Korean speakers for Secondary will learn Social structure of Korea, various social phenomena, and historical background.
 - Y11 Further Art IGCSE** - Work towards Art IGCSE
 - Y11 Biology Revision** - Revision will help to check pupils' understanding: it allows them to make links between different topics to see how the whole subject fits together. Students will be able to identify and fill gaps in knowledge, reminding and reinforce prior knowledge. Furthermore, it will help them to gain confidence in themselves, how the test is formatted and know what to expect on the day.
 - Online Blogging** - Britannica Blogging will create articles about school news and activities. Students will become journalists by writing and recording school events.
 - Chinese Editor's Club** - Native Chinese speaking students will have the opportunity to be editors for Britannica's annual Mandarin Essay Collection publication (中文校刊). They will plan and design the layout for the publication and will proofread the selected essays.
 - Reading Intervention (EAL Students only)** - Targeted English comprehension practice.
 - Reading Intervention (Non EAL Students)** - By invitation only, specific students will learn a range of reading skills and read a range of genres in order to develop strong reading habits
 - A Level IT Revision Club** - Revising IT subject work for the practical exam in April
 - Y11 Further Maths IGCSE** - Work towards FM IGCSE
 - Debate Class Year 9 - 12** - Scenario based questions and debates. Students will be put into two teams for each topic and be given a side. Collaborative research and communication skills are necessary to successfully share view points and ideas.
 - A-Level History Revision** - Preparation for History A-Level exams.
 - GCSE ICT Revision** - Revision booster for ICT Y11 practical paper examinations
 - Grammar Time** - Invitation only - specifically for students in need of literacy support, one-to-one intervention for grammar and punctuation

Secondary (Years 6+)

- Academic** **GCSE English Revision** - Revision booster for language, literature, and second language paper examinations
- Football Theory and Analysis** - Students learn about the greatest players, managers and coaches of the beautiful game.
- Y11 Further Maths IGCSE** - Work towards FM IGCSE
- Native Chinese Drama Club** - This activity offers students the opportunities to learn performing techniques in drama and speech presentation in Mandarin. We will prepare for Chinese New Year performance together.
- Creative** **Chinese Comic-making Club** - Students will create their own unique Chinese comics on the computer, including but not limited to your school life, family life, hobbies, food, etc.
- Minecraft** - Students explore virtually infinite and procedurally generated infinite worlds, using a map seed obtained from the system clock. Students are challenged to build learning spaces within an infinitely large game world generated on the horizontal plane.
- Embroidery** - Embroidery is stress relieving activity which allows students to keep their hands busy but mind focussed on the enjoyment and beauty of the task at hand. Learners are able to turn a plain piece of material into something beautiful and creative. This is both rewarding and satisfying as they are able to see their own designs come to life.
- Sustainable Art supplies** - The students learn how to make homemade art supplies from recycled materials and things found in the average kitchen. The aim is to help the school become more eco friendly and to teach students to appreciate and value the effort that goes into hand made supplies and to avoid being wasteful or careless with art supplies.
- Jazz Funk Dance** - An expressive and innovative form of dance that combines hip hop soul and groove with jazz technique. Students will learn fast paced combinations of movement while finding their own personal style and developing their choreographic skills.
- Podcasting** - Students learn how to concept, record, edit, launch and market a podcast.
- Warhammer** - Involves modelling, painting, therapy crafting, research and gaming
- Drama** - The students do basic drama exercises that help them improve confidence in public speaking. At the end of the term the students may recite dramatised poetry to an audience if they choose to.
- Illustration** - The students explore using different traditional art mediums to create their own illustrations. It is designed to focus on using pencils, markers, watercolours, and colour pencils. This activity offers students to learn about planning their art work and skillful techniques.
- Project-based Learning** - Students develop 21st century skills such as communication, collaboration, critical thinking and creativity through group work. (Academic & Creative)
- Music** **Audio Engineering and Theatre Operations** - Beginners course in live sound engineering and general theatre operations
- Fast Fingers Guitar Group (Year 5 and Secondary)** - Develop your with guitar skills with Mr Troy. All experience levels welcome
- Senior Music Hub/ Rock Band** - Invite-only ensemble music groups for secondary students. Potential recruits to contact Mr Muzyczka directly

Secondary (Years 6+)

Enrichment **Casual Chess** - Play Chess

Mind Games - Activities in which teams of students must try and work against other teams who will try and trick each other to ensure that they are the successful team

Dungeons and Dragons Club - Play the role-playing tabletop game, Dungeons and Dragons (maximum 7 students).

Young Entrepreneurs - My Little Business (10) - Students will create their own business focusing on making and selling handmade soap. Over the 7 weeks, students will develop their own company name, make their own soap, design and create their own packaging, complete a cost analysis and ultimately sell their product.

Britannica Charity Group - Planning events where the students can show their generosity and helpfulness especially toward the needy or suffering community .

Latin American Cooking & Culture Club - During this club students will have the opportunity to develop their knowledge of traditional Latin American food, cooking a dish each week, and will practice their Spanish spoken language, acquiring new vocabulary relating to the dish of the week.
