Primary

Very soon, we have our Energy Week beginning on Monday, 22nd January. Preparations for Chinese New Year performances are well underway and teachers are also busy making the last few arrangements with external providers for our residentials for Years 4 and above, which we hope to share with you as soon as possible.

In addition to all of these exciting activities, the children will be busy in classes learning about all kinds of fascinating things:
